This recitation will also be more rewarding the more time students spend on reading and thinking through the readings before coming to class. You should also make a habit of checking news sources (see below) on a regular basis to keep up with national and international events relevant to this class.

Participation: Participation in the recitation sessions is the main element of your grade for the recitation session. You are expected to offer your own insights based on class materials. To encourage participation, I will use random questioning, unannounced quizzes, and impromptu group assignments. Such assignments will count toward the participation grade.

Attendance in both the main lecture and recitation sessions is required - and will be taken using CUclickers. You must bring your CUclicker to lecture and recitation every time, otherwise your attendance will not be counted! As noted in the main class syllabus, each student starts out with 100 attendance points for the class (recitation session & lecture combined). Unexcused lecture or recitation session absences beyond the third one will decrease this point total by 10 points each. Use the three "freebees" wisely, for family affairs, job interviews, minor health problems, etc. but not on the exam days or when assignments are due; an absence on the due date does not mean that you can make the work up. Absences will be excused only in cases of serious health or family emergencies and appropriate documentation will be required. Please note that excessive excused or unexcused absences will also hurt your participation grade, because one cannot participate in class discussions if one is not present in class.
